E-scooters & E-bikes

It has been brought to our attention that some students are using e-scooters and e-bikes to travel to and from school. Please note the following:

- Privately owned e-scooters are illegal to use on public roads and in public spaces in London.
- Only rental e-scooters are legal, and riders must be 18 or over and hold at least a provisional driving license.

• E-scooters are not permitted on school premises under any circumstances.

Regarding e-bikes:

- Students aged 14 and over may legally ride an EAPC (Electrically Assisted Pedal Cycle), provided it meets legal specifications.
- Students riding an e-bike should wear a suitable cycling helmet, as should all students cycling to school.

We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our school community safe and compliant with the law.
