Dear Year 11 Parents and Carers,

Year 11 will complete their first set of GCSE mock exams this academic year. Please find their timetable attached below. These mock exams will prepare your child for their actual GCSE's which will be taking place in 7 months. This period should be taken as seriously as their GCSE's as it will give you, your child, and their teachers a very clear indication of where they are on their path to GCSE success.

Examination Schedule - Tuesday 21st October - Thursday 13th November 2025

- As normal, students should be in school no later than 8.35am every day. Breakfast study is available for students and can enter from 7.45am They will be able to enter through main reception between 7:45-8:15am.
- Students should be in school for the full day every day. Attendance and punctuality during this period remain vital. Please do not make any appointments for your child during this time.
- As your child completes their exams, they will return to their normal timetabled lesson.
- Spanish listening exams will begin week commencing November 14th more details will be shared with students in due course.

You can help your child by making sure they have the full equipment for each exam. They will require:

- A clear pencil case with at least TWO Black Pens, pencil, eraser, sharpener, ruler, protractor and scientific calculator.
- A water bottle (this must be clear with no labels and contain only water).

Our mock exam regulations are very clear and detailed. Not following them can lead to disqualification. To avoid this, students must:

- Begin exam papers only when instructed to do so
- Switch off and hand in all devices, including mobile phones and watches, before the start of each exam. We advise that students do not bring these items in on assessment days.
- Follow the instructions given by staff inside and outside the exam hall.
- Not to communicate or distract other candidates during the examination.
- Stay in the exam hall under exam regulations for the duration of each examination (unless otherwise instructed).





How will this data be used?

After reviewing the achievement of your child's outcomes from end of year exams, diagnostic and interim assessments completed this academic year, we will do the following:

- Group changes: Students will be placed in groups based on how they have achieved in key assessment points. Careful consideration will be applied when deciding on groups with their teacher, Head of Year and Head of Department contributing to final groupings
- Gap closing: Once exams have been marked, teachers will begin the process of reteaching key misconceptions from exams.
- Christmas Home Learning: Teachers will use the data gathered from mocks to inform what content to set as independent learning to complete over the Christmas break

Supporting your child from home - How to maximise your child's outcomes?

Many parents ask what they can do to support their child to revise independently at home. Please find below the EBA top 5 recommendations:

- 1. **Insist** on regular attendance at school absence is the most frequent reason for underperformance.
- 2. Support your child to follow an independent study schedule
- 3. **Monitor** your child's use of online gaming and social media so they do not have access to these during study times, and they disconnect completely up to an hour before bed. Remove electronic devices from your child's bedroom during sleeping hours.
- 4. **Consolidate** foundational knowledge in examination subjects by using the recommended online platforms (SPARX, KERBOODLE, SENECA, EVERLEARNER)
- 5. **Encourage** your child to complete exam-style questions and past examination questions, from the list of recommended revision guides.





Year 11 Parents'/Carers' Evening & Mock Results Evening – Thursday 11th December

The primary objective of this event is for your child to receive practical strategies on how to prepare in the run up to public examinations, you will also have the opportunity to hear about how to best support your child during this critical time from their teachers.

The event will begin promptly at 4:30pm in the main hall. Exam envelopes will then be distributed to families and staff will be available to answer any questions. Please note that attendance for students and their families is compulsory as this event is the primary vehicle we will use to distribute Students' mock examination results and the predicted grades they will need when applying for post-16 provision. Students must be wearing full school uniform. This event will give families and students the opportunity to reflect on current performance with subject teachers and set targeted next steps for improvement. Information on how to book appointments for Parents'/Carers' Evening will be shared with you in due course.
