**RE: Year 11 end of term report card**

We are pleased to enclose a copy of the report card for your son for the Autumn term. There have been several changes to the report card to help with communicating the progress your son is making

**Target**

The target column is a score from 1 to 9 which is based upon the GCSE grades your son will receive at the end of Year 11. The target is based on a computer algorithm relating to his previous achievement in his studies, including the work at Key Stage 2. This helps provide a guide to the grade your son will achieve if he has a good attitude to learning and pushes himself in class and at home in his studies.

**Mock Grade**

This is the actual grade that your son achieved in his mock exam where 1 is the lowest and 9 the highest. It will have a colour which tells you the following information

- Purple - Outstanding
- Blue - above target
- Green - on target
- Dark yellow - below target
- Red - considerably below target

These grades are important as it gives him access to the courses he wished to study at A level. If these grades are below 6 it is unlikely he will be accepted onto A level courses. If they are a mixture of 5s and 4s he may be accepted onto level 3 vocational courses. If they are 3, it is unlikely that your son will be accepted onto level 3 courses. If you could emphasise this to your son and explain how crucial it is he gets these grades it will help him focus. If these grades are below targets emphasise to your son, how he is not yet reaching his full potential

**Attitude to learning**

This column is about the effort your son puts into his classwork. The higher the number the more concerned the teacher is with the work and effort your son puts into the work. When scores are below expectations, please talk to him about the quality and quantity of work he does in the lesson.

**Homework**

This shows whether your son completes his homework and what standard that work is. Again, the higher the number the more concerned the teacher is. Homework is an important part of your son's learning as it helps him to build on the learning in lessons and gets him to establish routines around self-study which is essential to him achieving his full potential. To help your son with

homework, try to check in with him in the evening and see if work is due for the next day. Homework is also available via the Team's platform, so you will be able to see the work set.

### **Organisation**

This shows punctuality to lessons and having the correct equipment. Please ensure you check your son has all the equipment he needs for lessons including pen, pencil, ruler, calculator and any Math's equipment. It is essential that your son starts work promptly and completes the tasks accurately to ensure lesson time is used effectively for learning

The next report card you receive will also involve data about how he has achieved in the mid-year assessments that are happening after Christmas. A separate communication will be sent concerning the importance of these exams.
