

Maths Awards



The UKMT junior Mathematical Challenge took place in April, drawing participation from many students across the United Kingdom. This annual competition is a platform for young mathematicians to showcase their problem-solving skills and mathematical prowess. The event featured a series of challenging questions designed to test the participants' critical thinking and analytical abilities. 10 selected EBA students from year 7 and 8 represented the school this year with 8 students picking up Bronze, Silver and Gold awards for their excellent performance.

The UKMT Maths Challenge, organised by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust (UKMT), is a prestigious competition that has become an integral part of the academic calendar for students passionate about mathematics. It consists of a 60-minute, 25 multiple-choice question paper.



Extra Curricular - CCF

Ernest Bevin Academy Royal Marines cadets took part in a field training exercise over the weekend of 27-28 April. The aim was to allow cadets to experience camping out overnight in advance of their week-long summer camp in July.

Mr Riches and Mr Kay supervised the exercise which took place at Hankley Common in Surrey just South of Guildford. This area was used by the Canadian Army to train for the 'D-Day' campaign of 1944, when allied forces invaded Normandy in Northern France. Cadets were able to visit some of the defences constructed by the Canadians which they used to practice their techniques before the battle commenced on 6th June 1944.

The weather over the weekend was inclement and cadets learned that building their shelters properly really is a good idea - ideal practice for camp which, despite being scheduled in July, takes place in Dartmoor - famous for its unpredictable climate. Despite the rain, all cadets managed to stay cheerful and are now much better prepared for their summer camp.

Exams Focus - The final stretch

1. **Prioritise Topics**:

Focus on the most important topics likely to appear in the exam. Divide your study material into high, medium, and low priority. Cover the critical topics first.

2. **Eliminate Distractions**:

Create a distraction-free study environment. Turn off your phone, avoid social media, and find a quiet place to concentrate.

3. **Practice Past Papers**:

Use past papers to understand the question format and identify areas for improvement. Review your answers carefully.

4. **Review Your Notes**:

Go through your notes thoroughly. If you're unsure about any concepts, seek clarification from your teacher or tutor.

5. **Visual Aids**:

Utilise diagrams, flowcharts, and mind maps to reinforce key concepts. Visual aids enhance memory retention.

6. **Create a Summary Sheet**:

Condense your revision notes into a single summary sheet for quick reference.

Remember to take care of your well-being, stay hydrated, and get enough rest. You've got this!









At SWL Training Hub, we offer a range of opportunities including work experience and career events if you are considering a career within primary care. SWL Training Hub are pleased to announce a new WEX programme for school students in state schools in South West London.

(Please note that the programme will not accept students who study at independent schools on this occasion.)

The work experience application process for 2024 will open on Monday 11th March 2024 and <u>is for over 16 years old only.</u>

Please be aware work experience is popular and always oversubscribed, we therefore cannot guarantee a placement. Early applications are encouraged.

Work experience provides an opportunity to gain insight through observation into the many roles available within primary care.

Please note work experience placements are based at various practices in South West London and placements are unpaid. SWL Training Hub will not meet any costs of travel, subsistence, parking or accommodation.

We are offering a 3 day work experience internship which will have some classroom activities and the opportunity to shadow staff in a wide variety of job roles and areas, both clinical and non-clinical in primary care. The practices who offer work experience vary per borough due to organisational reasons.

To those who have applied, your responses will be reviewed by the SWL Training Hub Team and you will be contacted if your application has been successful. Unfortunately, a placement is not guaranteed. In the meantime, we politely ask you to please not contact the office in regards to your application status as the information provided will not differ from the information on this webpage.

Students must be a minimum of 16 years of age and study at a non fee-paying school in South West London.
