

A massive well done to the boys, who brought home Silver!




Good Luck Messages for our incoming Purple Ties


Trips

This month, we have had many exciting trips, including our transport enthusiast SEND students visiting the London Transport Museum, an A-level English trip to Keats House, a GCSE Geography trip to Battersea, a visit to Westminster Boys' School to film a promotional video for our boys' schools network and a rewards cinema trip for our Green Tie students.



Cambridge University

As part of our Oxbridge mentoring programme, the Sixth Form trip to Emmanuel College, Cambridge, was an enlightening experience for the students. The tour of Cambridge allowed them to explore the historic and picturesque environment of the university, enhancing their appreciation for its academic and cultural significance. During the visit, students attended a comprehensive session on the Cambridge admissions process, providing them with valuable insights into application requirements and strategies for success. They also engaged in super-curricular activities designed to stimulate intellectual curiosity beyond the standard curriculum. 






Enrichment Week

Extra Curricular - CCF

Fifteen cadets from Ernest Bevin's Royal Marines contingent attended the national summer camp in July. Cadets from all over the UK work together in small teams to undertake a variety of activities, including sailing, climbing, abseiling, camping and shooting.

The camp starts at the Commando Training Centre Royal Marines near Exeter in Devon and then moves to Dartmoor - an area notorious for rapidly changing weather. True to form, cadets had to cope with rain on some days and hot sun on others. However, cadets are prepared for this experience by training every Tuesday after school and one weekend per month.

Cadets attending Week 2, typically older and more experienced, travel as a group by train - meaning that the travel to and from camp is part of the adventure. Cadets attending Week 3 are transported to and from Devon by minibus. Mr Riches and Mr Kay also attended the final week of Camp to help run the activities.

One of the cadets (Ferdaws, Year 10) won the 'Best Shot' award of the week and in fact delivered the best performance across all three weeks.

Students can join the CCF in Years 8 and 9, with the next opportunity being in April 2025.
